What is Planned?

To develop a plan for delivering high quality and affordable community health and social care services to the people of the Forest of Dean which meet their needs now and in the future, and is developed with patients, the public and our key partners. The review will encompass all community services in the Forest of Dean including those within the community hospitals.
